“Mni Wiconi” Water is Life

Cody Two Bears is a member of the *Standing Rock Sioux Tribal Council*, representing the Cannonball district. The *Standing Rock Sioux Tribe* is fighting to protect its waters and sacred places from negative impacts of the *Dakota Access Pipeline* project, a 1,168-mile long crude oil pipeline that will transport nearly 570,000 barrels of oil each day from North Dakota to Illinois. The current proposed pipeline route crosses under Lake Oahe, just a half mile up from the *Standing Rock Sioux Reservation*,



which serves as the drinking water source for thousands of area residents. The pipeline would also run through land considered sacred to the Tribe. The *Army Corps of Engineers* green-lighted sections of the project without fully satisfying the National Historic Preservation Act, various environmental statutes, and its trust responsibility to the *Standing Rock Sioux Tribe*.
