Hilary Lambert, Lake Steward and executive director of the *Cayuga Lake Watershed Network*, will explain that the creek waters that flow into Cayuga Lake, and the lake itself, are not forever. Climate change and human misuse have destroyed big lakes elsewhere around the world. We must learn from those mistakes and ensure our lake's health – and that of other lakes and waters – for the long run, after we are gone. Not just for humans, but for the natural world as well. This talk will present information about the community groups and government agencies taking care of Cayuga Lake, and how you can help.
