

Title IX **BILL OF RIGHTS**

AS A STUDENT YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO:

MAKE A REPORT to local law enforcement and/or police;

HAVE DISCLOSURES of domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and sexual assault treated seriously;

MAKE A DECISION about whether or not to disclose a crime or violation and participate in the judicial or conduct process and/or criminal justice process free from pressure by Wells College;

PARTICIPATE in a process that is fair, impartial, and provides adequate notice and meaningful opportunity to be heard;

BE TREATED with dignity and to receive from the College courteous, fair and respectful health care and counseling services, where available;

BE FREE from any suggestion that the reporting individual is at fault when these crimes and violations are committed, or should have acted in a different manner to avoid such crimes and violations;

DESCRIBE the incident to as few institution representatives as practicable and not be required to unnecessarily repeat a description of the incident;

BE PROTECTED from any retaliation by Wells College, any student, the accused and/or the respondent, and/or their friends, family and acquaintances within the jurisdiction of the institution;

ACCESS to at least one level of appeal of a determination;

BE ACCOMPANIED by an advisor of choice who may assist and advise a reporting individual, accused, or respondent throughout the judicial or conduct process including during all meetings and hearings related to such process; and

EXERCISE CIVIL RIGHTS and practice of religion without interference by the investigative, criminal justice, or judicial or conduct process of Wells College.
