## *Alive or Undead?* Wild Food Foraging and the Fear of a Zombie Apocalypse

**Taylor Reid**, assistant professor of Applied Food Studies at the *Culinary Institute of America*, will explore the links between two recent phenomena: the meteoric rise in popularity of the zombie genre, and a surging interest in wild food foraging among survivalists, chefs, nature lovers, and average Joes. It is argued that both are connected to issues of environmental alienation and fears of ecological collapse. The presentation will also provide an introduction to foraging, and an overview of the health and nutrition benefits of many commonly available wild foods.
