

## Did you know?

Every year, Wells College sends out an online educational module through EverFi to all incoming new students. Students are asked to take a pre-survey to test their knowledge on Sexual Assault Prevention, Bystander Intervention, and similar topics. After about 30 days, participants are asked to take a post-survey to see if any of their knowledge or opinions have changed. Here are some interesting facts pulled from our reported information from new students from Fall 2018:

- **70% of those that participated in the post-survey stated they know how to report Sexual Assault at Wells College. While that number is good, we need to see it rise to 100%!**
- **Only about 55% of those that participated in the post-survey stated that they were confident that most students at Wells would take action in a situation in which someone is trying to take advantage of another person sexually. To us this means we could use some more bystander intervention trainings and education, to help people feel confident in intervening, and know others will as well.**
- **When asked if they had spoken up if they heard someone say something offensive or demeaning, almost 48% of those that participated in the post-survey stated they intervened to stop the behavior. Also, 50% stated they hadn't observed this happening on-campus- both answers are awesome!**

**We all know that there is always more education that can happen on-campus for Faculty, Staff, and Students. We are excited to announce that we will have another online educational module available for students to participate in, starting April 1<sup>st</sup>! This will not be mandatory, but is highly encouraged. Student Athletes will also be participating in a Sexual Assault Prevention module made specifically for Student Athletes.**
